



**1** The 'Fingers Crossed' **wall light** was designed by Partridge & Walmsley for Hungerford-based furniture company Benchmark. Made from locally sourced oak with an oiled finish, together with a recycled-aluminium shade, the light pictured, 55 x 61cm, costs £383. **2** Printed in the UK using water-based inks and paper from sustainably managed forests, 'Vanessa' **wallpaper**, shown here in mustard (top) and harvest orange, costs £45 a 10-metre roll, from Mini Moderns. **3** 'Kayar' **flooring**, composed of natural rubber and coconut fibre, is designed by Sottsass Associati for Artigo, which

ensures that over 90 per cent of production waste is recycled. It is available in 24 colours - shown here, anticlockwise from top, are 'K38' (putty), 'K74' (red) and 'K39' (black) - in either 1.9 x 10 metre sheets or 61cm square tiles, and costs £26.67 a square metre, sourced through Material Lab. **4** The 'Wellington' **chair** is handmade in Devon from locally sourced, FSC-certified oak. It measures 80 x 50 x 50cm, and costs £799, from Young & Norgate. **5** Another Country's 'Day Bed One' is made by hand in the company's Dorset workshop from FSC-certified European oak, with an organic coir,

wool and latex mattress. As shown, upholstered 'Bird Garden' fabric by St Jude's, it measures 4 x 180 x 90cm, and costs £1,850. **6** These can be used as a rug or as a floor covering. The striped wool-felt 'Ilam' **rugs** by Muskhane are handmade in Nepal. Muskhane ensures that water resources are carefully managed during production and in order to offset the carbon emissions generated from importing the rugs into the UK, the company contributes an annual fee toward the harnessing of solar power in Nepal.
